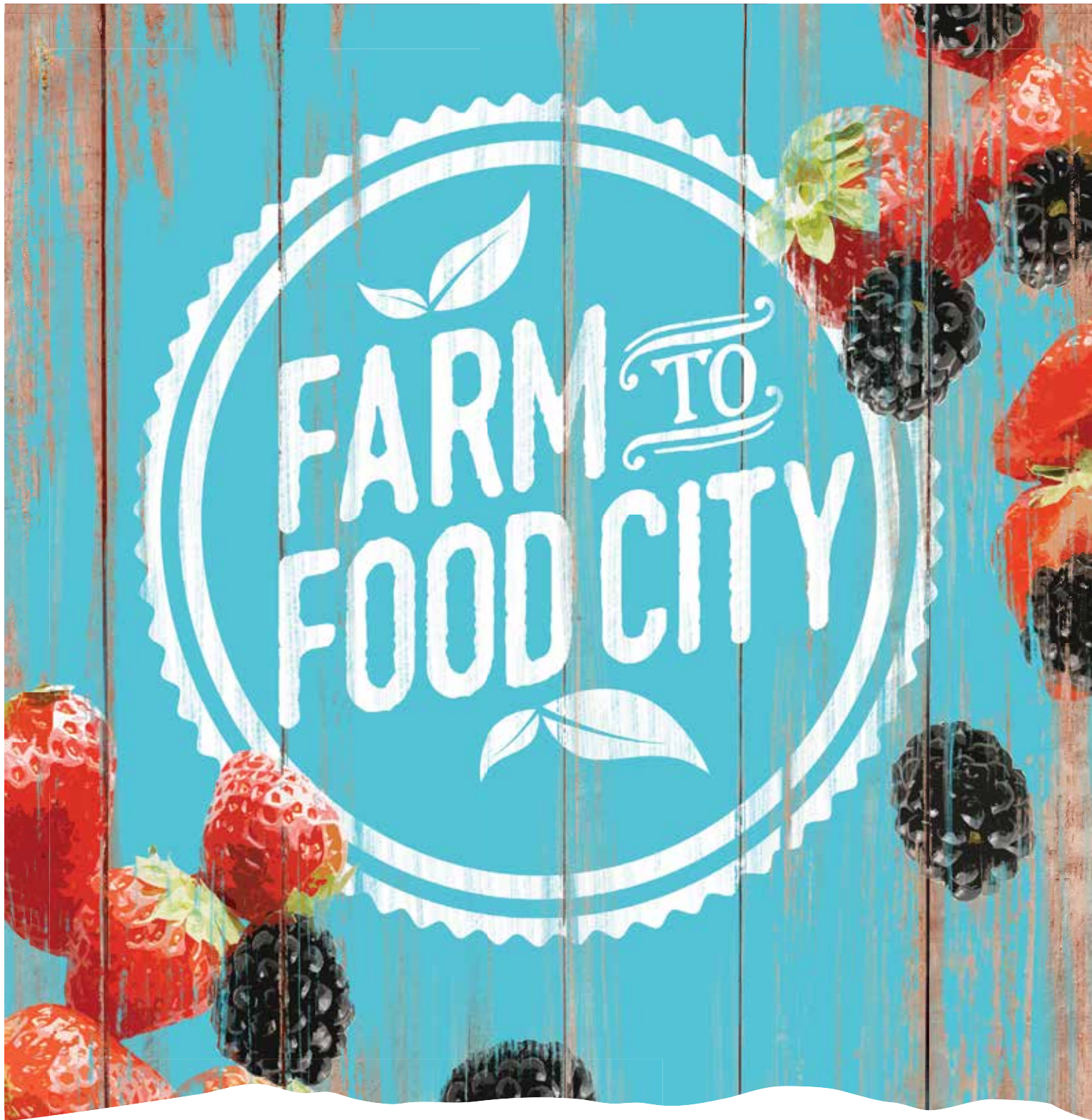

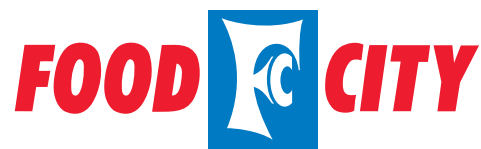

## COVER ART ARTIST AND BROCHURE DESIGNER BIOGRAPHIES

This year's brochure and catalog featured artwork created by Debbi Martin. Debbi is a native of Chilhowie, Virginia. After graduating from Chilhowie High School in '85, she earned her college degrees from the Art Institute of Atlanta ('87) and Emory & Henry College ('92). Debbi has been teaching high school art for over 28 years: first at Pulaski County High School and currently at Virginia High in Bristol. Her work has won Best In Show at the 2017 Virginia Highlands Festival; appeared in Colored Pencil Monthly magazine; been featured on merchandise for the official website of Zenyatta, the 2010 Thoroughbred Horse of the Year; and she created the logo for CDA Racing Stables in California. She hopes to retire from teaching in a couple more years and to finally be able to focus on needle felting, a craft she picked up during the pandemic after making her mother a needle felted chipmunk for her birthday. This year's brochure art featured apples in a circular design with a quilted texture. The catalog cover illustration was guided by input from the Apple Festival committee which wanted to showcase the traditional Appalachian crafts that have influenced the evolution of the Apple Festival over the past 70 years.

The Apple Festival brochure was designed by Brayden Havens using Debbi Martin's artwork. Brayden is a sophomore at Northwood High School where he is a member of the football team. As a freshman, he took a class at NHS called Design, Multimedia & Webtech. It was in that class where Brayden designed the winning brochure for the 2024 Apple Festival as part of a class project competition.

## DEAR PARTICIPANTS AND FESTIVAL VISITORS,

Welcome to the 2024 Chilhowie Community Apple Festival, Our Platinum Anniversary - 70th Annual Festival. We are happy to have you come celebrate with us. The following are highlights of the past 70 years of Chilhowie Community Apple Festival and Apple Festival Committee history.

The Chilhowie Community Apple Festival had its beginning on a dreary rainy night in March of 1953. A group of young men got together for the purpose of discussing the possibilities of improving the town of Chilhowie. During the evening, they decided to organize the Chilhowie Junior Chamber of Commerce. This organization received its Charter on April 21, 1953.

During the spring of the same year, some of these members visited the Apple Blossom Festival in Winchester, Virginia. They returned to Chilhowie and suggested that they stage a festival and pay tribute to the apple, rather than the blossom. This would be most appropriate since Chilhowie was the second largest apple producing center in Virginia for which Bonham Brothers and Duncan Orchards were the producers. Thus, plans and ideas developed for the beginning of the Chilhowie Apple Festival. The first festival was held on October 2, 1953 on the grounds of the Old Chilhowie High School. Crowds, far larger than anticipated, attended that year's events. It was estimated that 10,000 persons viewed the first parade!

The Festival continued to grow beyond what one club could manage. Therefore, in 1965, other civic clubs joined in, and the name was changed to the Chilhowie Community Apple Festival. The aspirations of the new board were the same as the original board to strive to have a Festival for which the town and surrounding communities could be proud. In the 1980s, weather-related crop losses and the deaths of the leaders of the Bonham family combined to cause a decline in the once booming Bonson's Apple business, dealing a blow to the apple industry in Chilhowie. The Duncan Orchard continued for several years more, but closed earlier this century.

The event was, and has continued to be, family and community oriented with activities for everyone. Over the years, various forms of entertainment have been a part of the Festival. The Entertainment has included: skydiving exhibitions, performances by professional square dancers, cloggers, and musical entertainers; a Model T car comedy, motorcycle rider show, hot air balloons, as well as pony and horse shows. Past public participation events were: tractor driving contests, talent shows, square dances, baby shows, sock hops, street dances, Kids Day activities, apple peeling contests, bike races, and barbecued chicken dinners. Regular events occurring during each Festival are: the beauty pageant, agricultural and crafts fair, pet show, parade, high school band competition, craft and commercial vendors, the food court, and a gospel sing.

The funds raised by the Apple Festival Committee have been used to pay for worthwhile projects which benefit the community. The Festival has made monetary contributions to the Town, schools, and community. Contributions have been made to band directors for band trips and uniforms, to Project Graduation, to schools for the purchase of equipment, to Chilhowie Elementary School for Williamsburg trips, to the Chilhowie Library for children's programs, to the Old High School Renovations Committee for many renovations, and to fire and rescue squads. The Festival Committee shared the cost with the Town for the stage at the community Park and for the street Christmas lights. Santa Claus, Christmas treats, and community lighted Christmas trees were a

Festival- sponsored tradition for over 20 years. Prior to each year's Festival, the committee purchases and decorates the town with Fall decorations such as corn, gourds, pumpkins, mums, and flags.

The band competition was the main source of revenue for the festival committee which enabled the committee to make those significant contributions back to the community. Over the years, many of the member civic clubs that supported the festival and supplied many of the numerous necessary volunteers disbanded as their memberships waned. The loss of the civic clubs greatly reduced the number of volunteers available to meet the festival's responsibilities. Due to the lack of festival committee volunteers, the Chilhowie High School Band Director, band students, and Band Boosters had assumed most of the responsibilities of the band competition. Once again, the festival committee had to adapt in order to ensure the continued survival of the festival. In 2013, because of the lack of volunteers and other circumstances, the decision was made to turn the Band Competition aspect of the festival over to the CHS Band Director and Boosters. (This has become their main fundraiser to pay for their bus fuel and drivers, uniforms, and music).

The Town of Chilhowie and the Apple Festival Committee have partnership in planning and executing the festival events. The Town of Chilhowie contributes public works, fire, and police personnel and services. They also provide other municipal services such as obtaining permits and coordination of services. The Apple Festival Committee volunteers plan and coordinate all of the festival activities: exhibits, craft and vendor booths, food court vendors, entertainment, parade and float judging, cruise in, pet show, and all related activities. These are then executed by committee and community volunteers.

Even with the Town's contributions, because the committee's sources of earned income are now limited to the sales in the committee's drink stand in the food court, vendor booth fees, and train ride tickets sales, the annual festival income is not sufficient to cover the costs of a single year's festival. Without our generous sponsors the festival could not continue. As we celebrate our Platinum Anniversary of 70 Years of the Chilhowie Apple Festival, we thank our sponsors for their sustained support. This unwavering support from the community will enable us to provide this extraordinary annual event for Chilhowie and the surrounding communities for years to come.

We hope that you are enjoying this year's festival. Please patronize our sponsors, and join us again next year for the 2025 Chilhowie Community Apple Festival, September 26-28, 2025. Safe travels.

# CATALOG DEDICATION

When tragedies occur their effects are far reaching regardless of where they occur, but their effects are magnified in small towns and close knit communities. Lives are so intricately intertwined that there are few individuals that are not in some way impacted when lives are lost or altered. Even if one does not know the individual personally, someone in their family does or they know a member of the affected individual's family. You or someone in your family went to school with them, worked with them, or their family members, you attended the same church, you watched them play ball, they coached your child's team, you always saw them in the grocery store or the gas station.... The list goes on. There is a connectedness here in small town America that you do not find anywhere else.

Just as the tragedy impacts the entire community, so does the desire to help, to "try to make it right", "to do what you can". The community unites with one spirit and a common goal. It heals itself through the pursuit of this purpose by supporting the individual's families and each other while working to lessen the impact of the tragedy. ## HUNTER REEDY AND MICHEAL FEDORCHUK BIOGRAPHIES

**Hunter Reedy** graduated from Chilhowie High School in 2014. After graduation, he pursued further education in CDL and Electrical courses at the Trade School. Ultimately, he found his calling in law enforcement, beginning his career at the Southwest Regional Jail. At the age of 21, Hunter took the next step in his journey by enrolling in the Bristol Police Academy. Upon graduation, he served the Chilhowie community as a police officer before joining the Smyth County Sheriff's Department.

Known for his adventurous spirit, Hunter enjoyed racing at the Wytthe Raceway with his Papaw McMahan, winning several feature races. He also tried his hand at bull riding! With a larger-than-life personality and an infectious laugh, Hunter was known for his outgoing nature and his willingness to help anyone in need. Above all, he treasured his family, especially his children, whom he considered the most important part of his life.



**Micheal Fedorchuk** was born in Hartsville, SC in January 1991. His family moved to Marion in July of the same year. Micheal attended Marion Senior High School where he graduated in 2009. In 2011 he moved to Staunton to be near his brother, Robert, who is a Virginia State Trooper. Micheal worked at Gold's Gym for a year before being hired at the Middle River Regional Jail in 2012. He moved back to Marion in 2015 and was hired at the Southwest Virginia Regional Jail Authority's Abingdon Facility. After working there for two years Micheal was hired by the Chilhowie Police Department in 2016. In 2020, he was hired by the Smyth County Sheriff's Office where he is currently serving as a K9 handler with his partner, Copper.

Micheal was wounded in the line of duty on August 9, 2024 while assisting Marion Police Department on a traffic stop. Micheal is a loving husband to his wife, Grace Fedorchuk, and their two daughters, Penelope and Palmer. He looks forward to being back at work with Copper.

## 2024 PARADE MARSHALS

When the Festival had grown beyond what one club could manage, in 1965, other civic clubs joined in, and the name was changed to the Chilhowie Community Apple Festival. The aspirations of the new board were the same as the original board to strive to have a Festival for which the town and surrounding communities could be proud. Each club had members who represented the club on the festival board of directors. These representatives all signed the newly drawn up by-laws for the Newly Formed Chilhowie Community Apple Festival. The three remaining original signers of this document are our Community Apple Festival Parade Marshals.

They are Barbara Sturgill, Richard Walker, and Laura Etta Wilkinson. Thank you for helping us continue.

Below are some of the memories of past festivals that they shared with us.

Richard Walker was one of the representatives of the Seven Mile Ford Ruritan Club on the newly formed Chilhowie Community Apple Festival Committee. He is currently the oldest surviving member of that club. For many years the club entered a float in the parade competition.

Richard's favorite memory of past festivals is of any early float entry. It was a mule pulled float featuring local Ruritan members dressed in beauty pageant costumes. It was called "Seven Mile Ford Beauty Queen" and placed high in the competition. Richard was the driver of the mule team.

He says that on at least two occasions the Ruritan Club members made apple butter during the festival "to show the next generation how it was made historically".

Barbara Sturgill was a representative of another one of the other civic groups that joined in the formation of the Community Apple Festival Committee. She was the one of the Home Demonstration Club's representatives on the committee.

Barbara recalls several fond memories of past events at the festival. One of these is J.S. Walker's horse drawn wagon loaded with children going through the parade and then later through the neighborhoods. She also liked it when the Shriners brought their clowns and their miniature cars to participate in the parade.

When there was a Children and Youth Day on the Friday of the festival when the county schools were closed for all day parent teacher conferences, she enjoyed seeing all of the children competing in the various activities including the pet show. Barbara says she misses all of the fried apple pies that used to be for sale at almost every food booth and all of the different apple vendors. Overall though she enjoys the festival as it is now with new events and a variety of vendors.

Laura Etta Wilkinson was one of the representatives on the committee from the Chilhowie Garden Club. She says that her earliest memories of the festival are of the many bands that marched in the parade on Highway 11 and competed on the field at the Chilhowie High School football field. If they competed they had to march in the parade.

Laura Etta recalls the barbecue plates that the Young Farmers Club sold. They were so good. She said that originally the Apple Festival Committee manned the concession stand at the band competition. At that time the committee did everything. She said that Dixie Huff, a committee member, would make two huge pots of chili for the hotdogs.

Another committee member, Margaret Jones, mother of Sara Kegley, started the craft booths by advertising that people could sell handmade craft items at the festival. It started with just a few spaces beside the sidewalk adjacent to Lee Highway. Laura Etta remarked "Look what she started. We now have more requests for spaces than we have spaces."

Reflecting on the festival itself Laura Etta said that without the Bonham brothers who owned the orchards and the Jaycees who proposed it, the festival would not exist. She says that the Boham's would set up a huge display of varieties of apples in the Old High School Gymnasium. It was very pretty and similar to the display on their apple float that they rode in the parade.

The Old High School was used as a school until 1990 when the Middle School addition was added to Chilhowie High School. In order to accommodate the increasing number of entries in the inside exhibits, Laura Etta says that they put long thin boards across the desk tops to create tables to display the items. Berry's provided the boards. The boys in the agriculture classes from the high school would help set everything up. Musical acts and other entertainment were held on the old football field which is now the little league field area

Laura Etta remarked that looking back you can see how far the festival has progressed and what the many volunteers have accomplished over the years. "Congratulations on the 70th anniversary. Chilhowie - a good place to live."

# CRAFT AND VENDOR BOOTHS

Craft and vendor booth set-up on Thursday, September 26th is by assigned times based on booth location. Booths will be open for sales on Friday, September 27th from 10:00 am until 7:00 pm, on Saturday, September 28th from 9:00 am until 8:00 pm and on Sunday, September 29th from 12:00 pm until 5:00 pm. These booth spaces are approximately 15'x15'. Applications for returning vendors are usually mailed the last week of May with a June 15th deadline. New vendor applications are mailed after June 15th with a July 15th deadline. New vendor spaces are filled on a first come first serve basis upon the receipt date of the completed application. To be added to the new vendor mailing list please send an email to [chilhowieapplefestival@gmail.com](mailto:chilhowieapplefestival@gmail.com) requesting to be added to the 2025 new vendor list. Include your complete postal mailing address and a description of what you will be selling in your email.

Non-profit and commercial information booths and demonstration booths are also available. Please follow the procedure listed above. No food or drinks may be sold from the craft, vendor, information, or demonstration booths. Concessions will be available and only those food vendors who have contracts with the Apple Festival Committee may sell food during the festival.

## GENERAL RULES

1. Crafters/ vendors will be responsible for their own set-up. (Tents, tables, etc.)
2. All merchandise shall be of a family oriented nature and shall not be offensive to the public or fellow crafters in any way. No items displaying suggestive connotations or profanity may be sold. The Outside Chairman shall have the discretion to determine what is offensive to the public or fellow crafters. Should there be a dispute, the decision of the Festival Committee shall be conclusive, and not subject to any contest. Offensive merchandise shall be removed from the festival grounds immediately.
3. All sales are between crafters/vendors and customers. Crafters / vendors are responsible for taxes due on sales. Tax forms are available from the Virginia Department of Taxation online.
4. No food or drinks may be sold from these booths. This includes canned, homemade, or commercial foods and drinks.
5. The Chilhowie Apple Festival name or logo shall not be used on any products.
6. The Chilhowie Community Apple Festival Committee reserves the right to limit space to anyone and to remove any applicant who does not abide by the Festival Rules. In any case of removal, there shall be no refunds.
7. Crafters / vendors may not sublet their spaces.
8. Crafters and Vendors will be issued parking passes and are to park in the parking area provided for them. We asked that you be respectful and do not block others in or the entrance/exit to the parking area.

## PLEASE NOTE OUR NEW RULE THAT BECAME EFFECTIVE IN 2022

9. Booths must be set up on Thursday afternoon, September 26th during your scheduled set-up time, based on your booth space location. You will receive a letter with your set-up time and an outline of the set-up procedure prior to the festival. Maps of both the booth space location and vendor parking will be included. You are required to unload and move your vehicle from the grounds during your allotted time. We asked that you unload as quickly as possible so that the next group can access their spaces during their allotted time. Once you unload and move your vehicle, it will not be allowed back on the grounds until tear down at 5:00 p. m. on Sunday, September 29th. Any items that you need to bring to or remove from your booth will have to be transported by foot. Security is provided from 7:00 p.m. until 7:00 a.m. Thursday, Friday, and Saturday nights. Failure to remove a vehicle promptly from the booth area after unloading or the re-entry of a vehicle in the booth area prior to tear down may result in the expulsion of the Vendor from the festival grounds, without any refund and exclusion from future festivals.

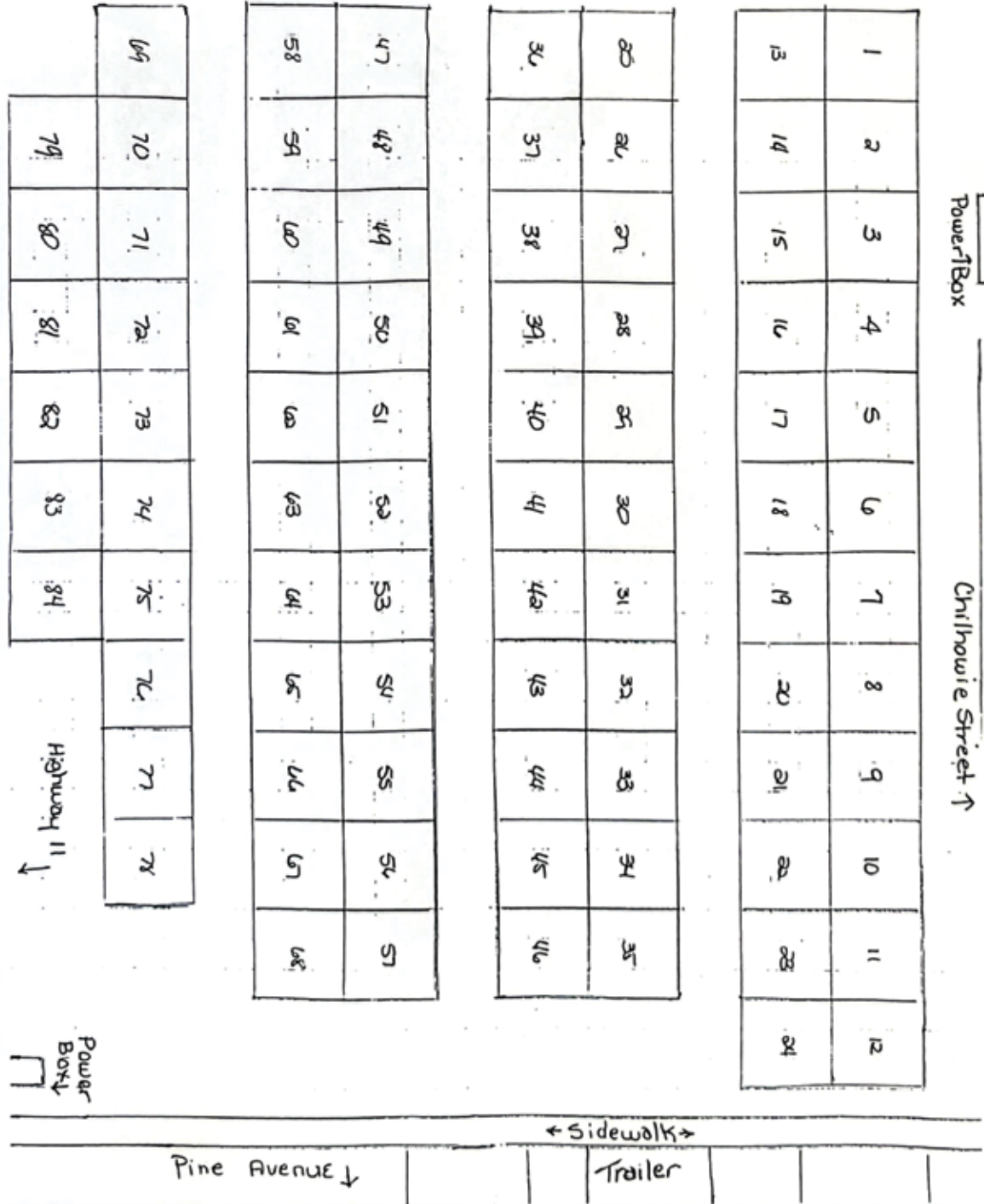

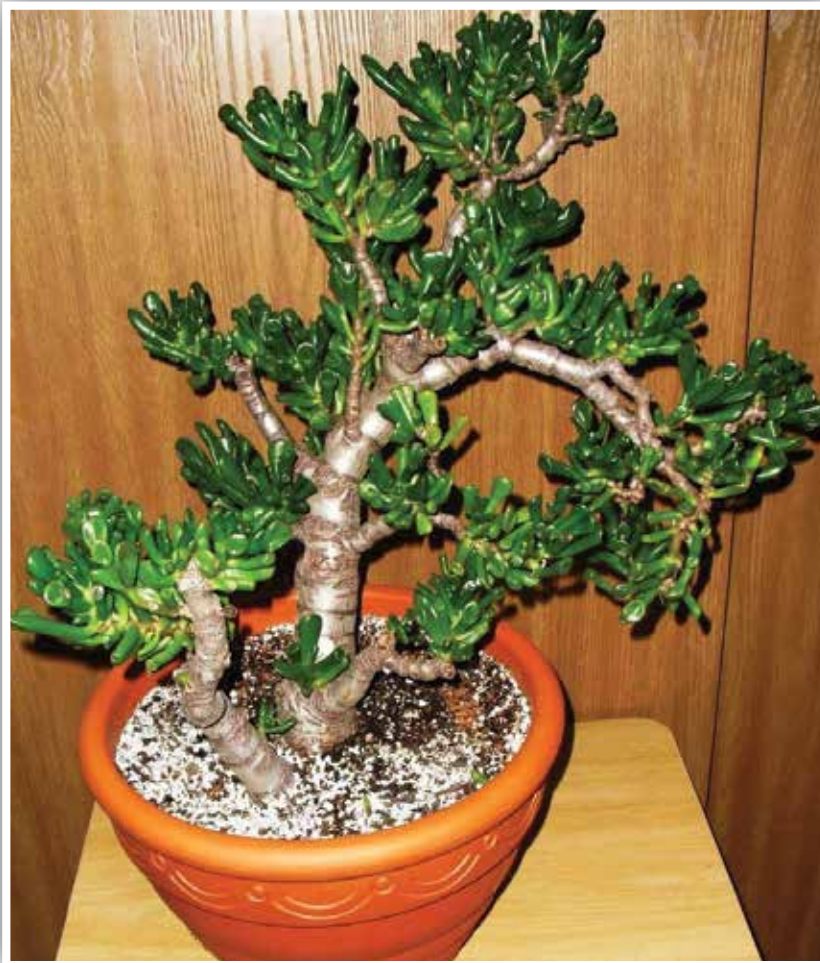

# THE APPLE FESTIVAL STORYTIME TRAIN

In 2004 the Apple Festival Committee decided that rather than having an entertainment company bring a train to the festival for people to ride, they would have their own train built. The entertainment vendor that had a children's train that had come to the festival for years was retiring. Of all of his rides, the train was the most popular. It was so popular that even though it was a children's train, adults and teenagers would squeeze into the cars and ride. This led to the idea to build a train with full size cars for everyone to ride.

Mike Martin, who was the festival president at the time, and other committee members recruited Bill Bise to build the train because of his metalworking skills. Six cars were to be constructed. Local businesses were contacted for donations to help pay for the construction costs. In exchange for their donation they would receive advertising on one of the six cars. Red Oak Construction, W and L Paving, Berry's Builders Supply, Carpet Outlet, New Holland Tractor, and Goodman's Jewelers generously donated. Lisa May, a local artist, painted the cars with children's storybook characters that were related to the businesses. Carpet Outlet provided the outdoor carpeting and vinyl seat coverings for the cars. With all six cars, the train was too long and heavy, so the cars were divided into two- three car trains. The committee purchased a used Gator to pull one train. They have relied on the kindness of community members who have loaned them a second ATV each year for use during the festival.

Before the 2023 festival two volunteers replaced the hitches and the door latches which had become worn though almost twenty years of use. The cars also need to be repainted. The committee plans to ask for businesses to cover the costs of the repainting with donations in exchange for advertising on the cars again before the 2025 Festival. The investors in the original construction received twenty years worth of advertising for their donations, hopefully this group will as well.

# 2024 GRAND PARADE

All participants in the parade must begin lining up at 8:00 am and be lined up in the designated staging areas by 9:00 am.

The parade will travel on Highway 11 through town to Chilhowie High School where it will disperse.

## FLOATS

**Floats will be judged before the parade promptly at 9:00 am.**

All area businesses, civic groups, schools, and churches are encouraged to enter floats in the parade observing the festival and parade theme,

**“Celebrating Our Platinum Anniversary, 70 Years of Apple-Lachian Traditions”**

**The floats will be judged in four categories:**

1) Commercial 2) Youth 3) Civic 4) Religious

First, second, and third place ribbons will be awarded in each of the four categories. Ribbons will be placed on both sides of the float to be displayed as the floats travel the parade route.

**Monetary prizes will be awarded in each category as follows:**

1st place - \$100, 2nd place - \$75, and 3rd place - \$50.

**Floats will be judged in the following areas:**

- Depiction of Theme - 25 points
- Originality and Creativity - 25 points
- Color Coordination - 10 points
- Complexity of Design - 10 points
- General Appearance - 10 points
- Workmanship - 10 points
- Balance - 10 points

Float winners will be announced prior to the crowning of the festival queen in the Chilhowie High School Stadium before the beginning of the band competition.

Rules for all parade participants:

- 1) No fruit, candy, or other articles may be thrown from vehicles or floats or by marchers. Participants are to arrange for representatives to walk beside their units and hand items directly to spectators.
- 2) No horns or sirens may be blown.
- 3) No mini-bikes, three wheelers or four wheelers will be permitted in the parade.
- 4) Any marching or twirling groups with younger children must have a follow-up vehicle in which the children may ride if they become too tired to continue.
- 5) A current negative Coggins Test is required for each horse in the Parade and test papers will be checked before the parade begins. Per Health Department Regulations.

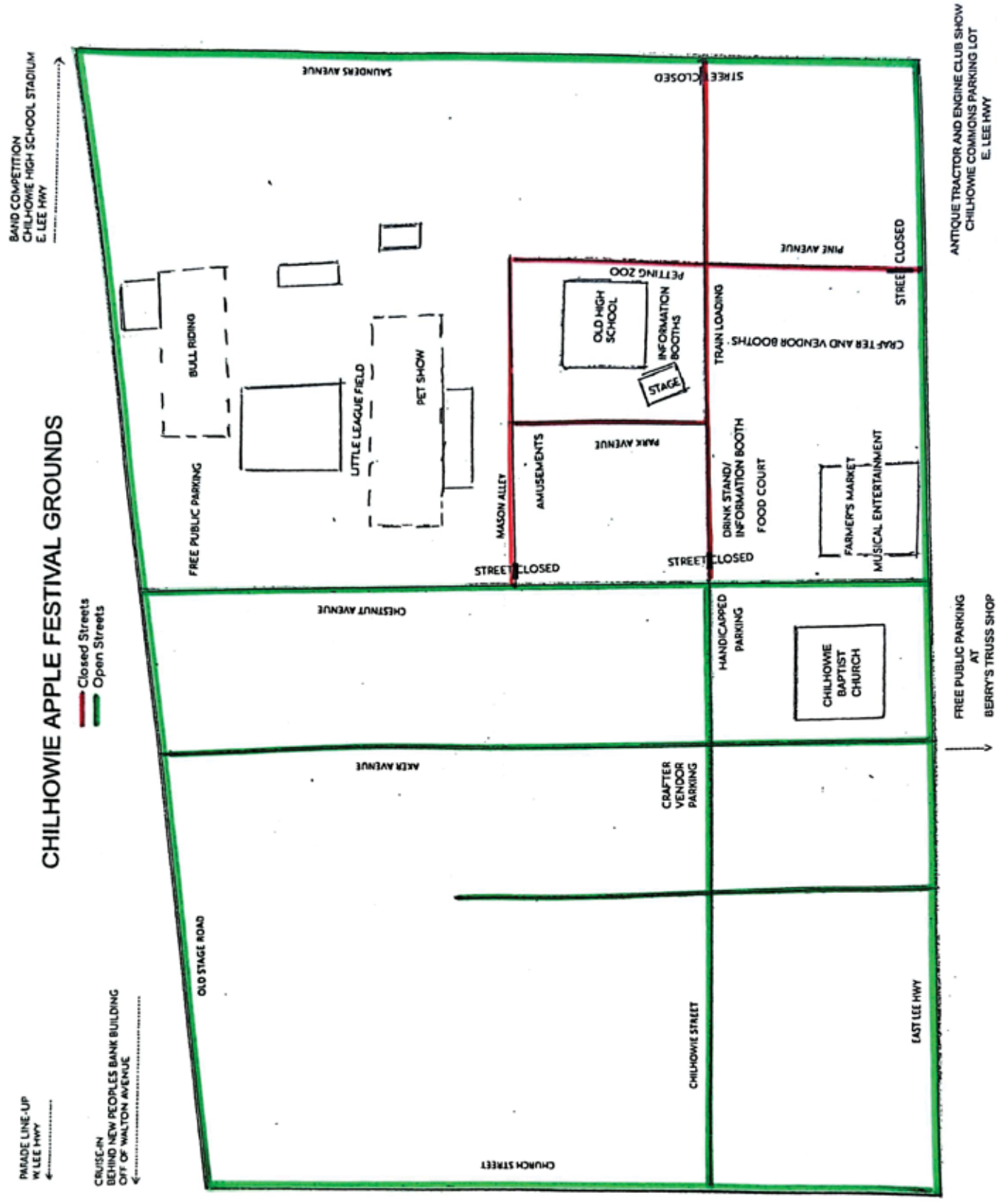
